JANUARY PROGRAM Featuring Walter Marinetti

Walter Marinetti lives in Raleigh and is on the staff of the pottery studio of the Sertoma Arts Center. He has been a member of the Visual Art Exchange (previously the Wake Visual Arts Association) for about twenty five years, serving on the Board several times, as Editor of the newsletter, and as Chair of the Display Committee. He also served as Treasurer of the Triangle Potters Guild. His latest personal project has been creating the Urn of Keats' "Ode



on a Grecian Urn," which he will discuss and display at our next meeting, January 4, 2011.

Walter has been creating ceramic art for the last twenty four years. Techniques and types of clay have covered a wide range, from tiles to hand-built forms to wheel-thrown

pieces, to works fired in raku, gas-fired, and electric kilns. Clays include low fired earthenwares, high fired stonewares and porcelains. The greatest part of his work has been done in the Sertoma Arts Center.

Marinetti has also worked in two dimensional media such as oil, watercolor and acrylic, starting with stage design and exhibits work and later for entry in shows. Both pottery and paintings have been in many shows (NC Pottery Center, Raleigh Fine Arts, State Fair, Sertoma one man shows, etc., and often taken prizes.
