### Meeting agenda: Charles Joyner — Clay works of Northern Ghana

Charles Joyner will be our guest presenter on "Clay Works of Northern Ghana." During his recent travels to West Africa, he has documented the use of clay as the primary medium for pottery and architecture. Joyner's research relating to customs and traditions of African-American communities and those of West Africa have sparked his innate curiosity about their similarities and differences. His work illustrates his keen interest in exploring those communities and customs that are either being lost because of or adversely altered by the advancement of technology.

Charles Joyner is a Professor of Design at NC State University's College of Design. He has been creating, exhibiting, and teaching art for the past 25 years. His work has won awards in national exhibitions and is exhibited in museums and galleries throughout the Southeast. He has earned a BA in Art & Design from NC A&T and a Master of Fine Arts Degree from UNC-Greensboro. He also has an extensive background in university administration, serving as both department head and assistant dean during his tenure at the School of Design at NC State.
